## We have EXCITING news!

Last year we applied for an Artist In Schools grant for 2017 and have been successful! Our Visual Arts teacher Jeenah Metcalfe developed a project idea with Rob Scholten, a Melbourne based artist that will result in a series of art installations in the central courtyard of our school. The project will involve not only *all* students, *all* staff and parents but a range of members from the wider community.

The project entitled **River of Voices** encourages an exploration of local history, culture and the environment and the changes to community over time. It considers the role of the Yarra River, explores the culture of the Wurunjderi people, promotes understandings about agriculture and the impact of urbanisation, the modern climate as well as encourages students to make predictions about the future. Throughout the project members of the community to which Warranwood PS belongs, will share their stories with our students aka the 'Voices' component of this project.

Students will look for ways to answer 3 key questions:

### What was life like? What is life like? What might life be like in the future?

The project has three aspects:

**Researching** as a part of classroom programs

**Translating** ideas and feelings through a range of hand drawn designs into visual artworks that express the learning that occurred in the classroom.

**Making and creating** art on tiles using paint.

The first part is underway! The second and third aspects are components of the Visual Arts program and will begin towards the end of this term and in conjunction with Rob Scholten who will be our artist in residence for approximately 20 days during Term 3.

### What can you do?

- Share your own stories with your child/ren. Try to answer the 3 key questions using your personal experiences. You may also have family members and/or friends who have valuable information to share.
- Explore local areas including but not limited to Warrandyte, Warrandyte south, Warranwood, Wonga Park, Croydon, Lilydale, Ringwood and Ringwood North. There are many historical walking trails and places of interest that you can visit. Council websites provide a great deal of further information.

Speak to your classroom teacher if you think you know of someone who might have an interesting story to share with our students. We can arrange for them to be interviewed and filmed by the senior School HAWK research group working with Andrew Tonkin this term. They will share it with all classes. Join our Facebook page [Warranwood River Of Voices](#) for regular updates and photos of the project.

The results of this project will be an exciting intersection between art, history and culture. If we can imagine this as something that is alive, that affects us and is affected by us, the students and other participants will gain a greater understanding of where they come from and how they can positively impact their community. And by looking back at the past, it will also give a higher awareness of the future and our individual impact.

This is a BIG project that involves many people. We want you to be a part of the journey with us by creating artwork for the mural also. More details about this soon!

### MANAGING SCREEN TIME AT HOME!

It can be a real challenge to lock horns with young people who feel they are the only ones whose parents don't allow unlimited screen time! "Everyone else is allowed to!" - I hear this all the time from my 15 year old and in fact often get told I'm just old fashioned!!!! Please have a look at this tip sheet and reflect on how it might be useful to you and your family as it is always better to prevent a problem rather than cure it! Screen time and dependence is a challenging issue for many young people to sort through and come to terms with and the hints below might prove to be very handy!

**8 tips to keep on top of your child's screen time**

- Plan screen-free time, like outdoor play, music and sport.** (Icon: person on a skateboard)
- Lead by example - reduce your own screen time.** (Icon: person with arms raised)
- Agree on daily screen time limits. It's not punishment, it's about keeping a balance.** (Icon: scales of justice)
- Be involved - watch TV and play games together.** (Icon: video game controller)
- Start with small reductions to help lessen any resistance.** (Icon: clock)
- Use tech tools to manage access, such as parental controls.** (Icon: laptop with padlock)
- Set tech-free zones and times at home - e.g. all screens off in bedrooms after a specified time.** (Icon: Wi-Fi symbol)
- Resist giving mobile devices to children when going out - take books or toys instead.** (Icon: child with a book)

## Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge 2017

The Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and we are excited about participating again this year.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to 16 years in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition, but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by the closing date of the challenge.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Definitions:** *Department* refers to the Victorian Department of Education and Training. *Person* refers to the child/adult listed below in the consent declaration.

### 1) Privacy Protection

The Department takes its privacy obligations seriously and any personal information collected or used by the Department will be handled in accordance with the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic). This law sets out what we must do when the Department collects, uses, handles and destroys personal information. Personal information includes personal details such as an individual's name and school that could be used to identify an individual.

### 2) Collection, use, disclosure and storage of personal information

If you provide your consent your school will collect and disclose your child's first and last name, and the name of the school to the Department. The Department will then:

- Use the information to register your child and to generate an online account (through which school age children can record the books that they read);
- Publish your child's name and year level on its online Honour Roll located at: [www.education.vic.gov.au/prc](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/prc) at the completion of the Challenge with no other identifying factors such as school name.
- Give the name of your child to Finsbury Green Pty Ltd ABN 52 007 743 151 who will then disclose to a 3rd party for the purpose of printing Certificates of Achievement.

### 3) Accuracy, access to information and withdrawal of consent

The Department will endeavour to ensure that any personal information held about your child is up to date and accurate. You can access, correct and withdraw personal information held by the Department by written request in accordance with the Department's Information Privacy Policy located at: <http://www.education.vic.gov.au/Pages/privacypolicy.aspx>
